

BUDGETED REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES


FINANCIAL RESULTS

TTBH came in over budget in FY 2013 by \$3.4 million. This does not include 1115 Healthcare Transformation waiver monies of \$5,673,061. These funds were transferred to the Construction fund for the expansion of Center facilities. Medicaid revenues were budgeted higher than actual due to an anticipation of hiring staff to perform more services, but capacity to house additional staff was limited. Salaries came in under budget due to difficulty in finding qualified staff. This also resulted in higher professional and consulting expenditures. Fringe benefits were budgeted at 29% and actual benefits were 22%. This is attributed to employees not choosing to be covered under the Center's health plan.

STRATEGIC PERFORMANCE FY2013

20,466 unduplicated clients were served in FY13, with 7,234 served through crisis services (28,538 encounters). 18,432 of clients received MH services and 3,478 served in IDD. 30% served 17 or under, 41% between 18-40 and 29% 41 and over.

TTBH has 503 full time employees and seven part time employees.
